

Emergency Medical Technician Class

Spring 2022 Courses

Lecture/Lab –Mon-Wed-Fri (time below) & Saturdays 0900-1730 Field Work – varies (Assigned dates) 0900-1900

This course follows the curriculum specified by the Kansas Board for Emergency Medical Services for instruction of persons planning employment as Emergency Medical Technicians. Outside-of-class reading and homework assignments are required. After successful course completion, the student is eligible to take the National EMT Registry test for credentialing as an EMT in Kansas.

This course has both online and face-to-face components. Assigned readings and assignments are posted online, in our Learning Management System (Canvas) and must be completed prior to each class/lab meeting. Discussion and skills are practiced during face-to-face class/lab sessions at MATC. Please allow at least 4-6 hours per class/lab date to complete all online assignments. Students must be able to consistently access the Internet to obtain & complete course assignments by due dates. Students may use their personal computer or a public computer (TLC, school or public library). Zoom meetings may be necessary due to the pandemic.

Applicants must be at least 17 years of age to participate in the National Registry EMT Exam.

Class enrollment will close once 15 students are enrolled.

Required for enrollment:

- <u>Two (2) personal documents</u>: state-issued photo ID and your Social Security card (not just the number);
- Negative TB Screening
- Evidence of current year Flu Vaccination: completed for the current influenza season (when available).
- Evidence of Covid-19 vaccination: Required by clinical facilities

Fees must be paid at the time of enrollment (or sponsor letter presented**). Includes testing fees. <u>High school students</u> may be eligible for reduced cost per *Excel in CTE*, a career-technical education initiative approved by the Kansas Legislature.

EMT Uniforms for Class, Lab & Field Work

EMT students will be required to wear a specific uniform during all lecture & laboratory date/times.

Uniform Requirements:

Footwear

Black boots. Sandals, canvas, clogs, heals or "crocs" are not allowed. Footwear must be clean & maintained. You may use any vendor of your choosing.

Uniform Top

Students will wear a Manhattan Tech polo. Polo's will be ordered following enrollment. Then enrollment form has a place to put your size.

Uniform Trousers

Students will wear navy blue "Cargo" style trousers. Jeans style, shorts or other types of trousers will not be allowed.

Name Badge

A MATC issued name badge will be used for identification in the Hospital/Field Internship environment. No exceptions to wearing your student name badge. The name badge will also be worn to all class/lab sessions.

For safety reasons, this uniform identifies the person as a student during the clinical experience.

Anticipated cost is in the neighborhood of \$30-\$57.00 for the trousers, \$30-80.00 for the boots and up to \$40.00 for the polo.

Uniform hints:

- Ladies, its recommended you wear a snug undershirt over your undergarments to prevent accident exposure of your upper body.
- Men, clean appropriate underclothes will be worn.
- For comfort, launder the uniforms prior to wearing them.
- Personal hygiene is an essential part of the Health Care field.

EMT Basic Life Skills Examination
