Dear Prospective Medical Laboratory Technology Student,

The faculty and staff of the Manhattan Area Technical College and the Medical Laboratory Technology (MLT) program appreciate your interest in our program. This packet will help guide you through the Application Process and provide you with the information about our Admissions Criteria and Selection Process.

The MLT program is accredited by the National Accrediting Agency for Clinical Laboratory Sciences. The program is one year in length after 24 credit hours of prerequisites are completed. Upon completion of the program, students earn an AAS in Medical Laboratory Technology and qualify to sit for a Medical Laboratory Technician certification exam.

Admission into the program is competitive. Applicants must meet the minimum requirements of Manhattan Area Technical College and the Medical Laboratory Technology program for admission to Manhattan Area Technical College's MLT program.

<u>Note Deadline:</u> Your Manhattan Tech Admissions Application as well as the required Medical Laboratory Technology Admissions Packet and the documents listed within must be received on or before the 1st business day of March to be considered for admission into the Medical Laboratory Technology program. Any exception to this date would be at the discretion of the MLT Program Coordinator.

Enclosed is information that is critical for a successful application—please read the entire packet carefully. I encourage you to make an initial advising appointment by contacting the Student Services office at 785-587-2800, for information about college admissions and the Medical Laboratory Technology program. The college website at www.manhattantech.edu also provides additional information about our programs.

Academic Criteria

To be considered for admission in the MLT program, applicants must meet the following criteria and submit all requested credentials and documentation:

Applicants are currently in progress OR have completed the following prerequisite courses with a grade of C or higher.

Note: ALL prerequisite courses must be COMPLETED OR IN PROGRESS PRIOR TO THE APPLICATION DEADLINE (March 1) to be considered for admission. Any exceptions to prerequisite course completion dates would be at the discretion of the MLT Program Coordinator.

^{*}Anatomy and Physiology: Course can be completed as one or broken up as two courses (must add up to a minimum of five (5) credit hours).

Prerequisites exist for some courses. Check the Manhattan Tech catalog requirements and contact your advisor for more information. College Placement testing may be required to determine where you place in math and English. Consult your advisor for more information, and check well in advance of the semester when you plan to enroll in a math course.

Non-Academic Criteria

The following criteria applies to **ALL** applicants:

Immunizations - DOCUMENTATION REQUIRED UPON ACCEPTANCE INTO THE MEDICAL LABORATORY TECHNOLOGY PROGRAM

These requirements are in place for the health and safety of Manhattan Tech MLT students. By contract with your academic institution, all students participating in the MLT program must meet the following health and safety requirements. All documentation must meet requirements at all times during the courses.

1) MMR Documentation

a. Two (2) doses or proof of immunity by titer

2) Chickenpox (Varicella)

- a. Two (2) doses or proof of immunity by titer
- b. Will NOT ACCEPT HISTORY OF CHICKENPOX Chickenpox is an immunization that is often incomplete. We can only accept proof of vaccination or a titer. We cannot take anyone's testimony that you had chickenpox, not even a physician. Make sure that you have either vaccines or a titer. Paperwork for a low titer will not be accepted.

3) Tetanus (TDAP)

a. One (1) dose taken less than 10 years ago

4) Hepatitis B (Hep B)

a. Three (3) doses or proof of immunity by titer - Hepatitis B is required by vaccine or titer. If your titer is low, you should get the vaccine. Paperwork for a low titer will not be accepted. As the Application Information and Instructions state, you should get the Hepatitis B early, as it takes 6 months to complete the series as required.

5) **TB (tuberculosis) test**

a. Not due until end of August once accepted into program. Information given at orientation.

Medical Laboratory Technology Physical and Environmental Requirements

The MLT Program is a discipline with cognitive, sensory, affective and psychomotor performance requirements. Based on these requirements, the following list highlights the Physical and Environmental Requirements that have been developed. Each standard has an example of activities which a student will be required to perform, with or without an accommodation, while enrolled in the MLT program at Manhattan Tech. The Physical and Environmental Requirements should be used as a guide to assist applicants in determining whether or not accommodations or modifications are necessary in order to meet program participation requirements.

Applicants who identify potential difficulties with meeting the Physical and Environmental Requirements should communicate their concerns to the MLT Coordinator. If the concern is related to a documented disability, applicants are responsible for contacting the Student Retention Specialist. Determination of reasonable and appropriate accommodation will be made on an individual basis in consultation with the Student Retention Specialist. Additionally, applicants should assess their aptitude and ability to perform professional duties by reviewing the Physical and Environmental Requirements and; if necessary; discuss them with their healthcare provider.

Background Check - COMPLETED UPON ACCEPTANCE INTO THE MEDICAL LABORATORY TECHNOLOGY PROGRAM

The completion of a criminal background check is one of the admission requirements to the MLT program. Specific requirements in regards to the background check will be given at orientation. The background check is required to ascertain:

1) The ability of students to attend mandatory rotations at external facilities in accordance with the requirements of the program.

Because a criminal history can have different effects at the educational and employment levels, when a person is considering pursuing a health career, it is best to have as much information as possible prior to deciding to enroll in a health program. Manhattan Tech encourages individuals who have criminal histories and who are interested in pursuing a health career to:

- 1) Contact approved MLT education programs and ask about the programs' enrollment criteria with respect to criminal convictions; AND
- 2) Contact healthcare facilities and inquire about hiring criteria with respect to criminal convictions.

Acceptance Process

Admission to the Manhattan Tech MLT program is determined through a competitive selection process. Submission of an application does not guarantee a position in the program. Refer to page eight (8) for the Medical Laboratory Technology Admissions Scoring Rubric. Interviews will be conducted by the MLT Coordinator if the applicant number exceeds the total seat allotment for the program.

If you are admitted into the MLT program without having all required prerequisite courses completed at the time of the application deadline, you will be required to have the remaining prerequisite courses completed with a "C" (2.0) or better before the MLT program starts. Official transcripts will need to be submitted to the Registrar for these courses. This also applies to those who are placed on the alternate list and then asked to join the MLT program.

After the application deadline, files will be scored utilizing the MLT scoring rubric and applicants that completed an MLT Packet will be notified in writing of their acceptance, alternate, or denied status. Applicants offered a seat in the program must complete a letter of intent indicating their plan to accept or decline enrollment in the MLT program by the date designated in the notification letter.

Failure to respond will result in forfeiture of a seat in the MLT Program.

Student Responsibilities Upon Acceptance

After acceptance to the program, students will be required to attend program orientation. Students will be notified of the date and time of the orientation in the acceptance letter. Specific information about the requirements bulleted below will be provided at program orientation and will need to be completed by the first day of classes. Please do not submit the information below until you are accepted. All the information below needs to be submitted to the MLT Program Coordinator.

- Immunization records for the following Immunizations/vaccinations
 - o MMR Documentation
 - Two (2) doses or proof of immunity by titer
 - Chickenpox (Varicella)
 - Two (2) doses or proof of immunity by titer
 - Will NOT ACCEPT HISTORY OF CHICKENPOX
 - Tetanus (TDAP)
 - One (1) dose taken less than 10 years ago
 - Hepatitis B (Hep B)
 - Three (3) doses or proof of immunity by titer
 - TB (tuberculosis) test not due until end of August
- Background Check The student is responsible for the additional fee.
- **Health Insurance** Students are required to hold health insurance during their enrollment at Manhattan Tech in the MLT program
- Home Computer and Internet Access Students should have a reliable home computer with high-speed Internet access.

Failure to provide the items listed above may result in dismissal from the program.

Reapplication

Applicants who are not selected for admission are encouraged to submit a new MLT packet for the following year. Manhattan Area Technical College Admissions Applications are good for three (3) years. Those not selected for admission are encouraged to talk with an advisor about how to increase their admissions scores.

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Explanation of Immunization Requirements

All immunizations below need to be completed after acceptance into the MLT program.

Some series below take 6 months to complete so plan accordingly.

MMR (Measles/Rubeola, Mumps, & Rubella)

Options to meet this requirement:

- 1. Provide a copy of proof showing a positive IgG antibody titer for Measles/Rubeola, Mumps and Rubella.
 - a. If the titer results are POSITIVE, attach a copy of the lab results to the MLT admissions application.
 - b. If the titer results are NEGATIVE or EQUIVOCAL, you must get your MMR series. After the first shot, you will be required to complete the second MMR after 28 days and submit proof to Manhattan Tech.

OR

2. Complete one series of MMR immunizations. One "series" of immunizations includes immunization for each disease on separate dates at least 28 days apart.

Varicella (Chickenpox)

Options to meet this requirement:

- 1. Provide a copy of proof of positive IgG antibody titer for Varicella
 - a. If the titer results are POSITIVE, attach a copy of the lab results to the MLT admissions application.
 - b. If any of the titer results are NEGATIVE or EQUIVOCAL, you must get your first Varicella vaccination and the second Varicella must be completed after 30 days and proof submitted to Manhattan Tech.

OR

2. Show proof of or complete one series of Varicella immunizations. One "series" of immunizations includes two shots separated at least 30 days apart.

Tetanus/Diphtheria/Pertussis (Tdap)

Options to meet this requirement:

1. You must provide proof of Tdap vaccination, followed by a Tdap booster every 10 years.

Hepatitis B (Hep B)

Options to meet this requirement:

- 1. If you have not received the injections in the past, do not get a titer. Provide a copy of proof showing a positive IgG antibody titer for Hep B.
 - a. If the titer results are POSITIVE, attach a copy of the lab results to the MLT admissions application.
 - b. If the titer results are NEGATIVE or EQUIVOCAL, you must get your Hep B Booster.

OR

1. Show proof of or complete one "series" of Hep B immunizations. You must obtain the first injection, then the second injection is given 1 to 2 months after the first dose and the third injection is 4 to 6 months after the first dose.

TB (tuberculosis) Test

1. Not due until August once accepted into program. Information will be given at orientation.
